

Wading into work on the wetlands

We're happy to announce that construction of the wetlands to the west of Bells Road has begun. It's exciting news for our residents, as the natural beauty of this area will add immensely to St. Germain's visual and recreational amenity.

The wetlands will be fully landscaped with an abundance of local flora, and a meandering walking trail (complete with seating) will make it a destination to enjoy whatever the season.

But there's also a practical aspect to the wetlands. When complete, this area will help manage St. Germain's water catchment and drainage in a way that is both beautiful and natural.

We expect the western wetlands to be completed early in 2022, but that really depends on the weather. We all hope that adverse conditions don't slow our progress.

Another wetlands to the east of Bells Road is also in the pipeline, but the water authority that will ultimately manage these areas must give us some direction before we can confirm when work will commence. Stay tuned!

Answers to common questions

Who should I contact if rubbish has been dumped on my property?

The dumping of rubbish in any part of the estate is inexcusable, but especially frustrating when this occurs on private property. If residents witness dumping or littering, we encourage you to submit details along with any evidence to St. Germain at residents@stgpg.com.au or report to council directly. We also recommend purchasers install temporary fencing while they are waiting for construction to commence on their home. This is the best way to deter those who would try to do the wrong thing and dump rubbish on vacant lots.

Who do I contact if one of the park BBQs isn't working?


How can I keep up to date with construction progress at St. Germain?

Driving the Bells Road extension



More good news for our community – an extension is planned to connect Bells Road with the southern section of our St. Germain estate.

Ultimately this extension will connect to sections of Bells Road further south (yet to be constructed), all the way through to Hardys Road.

Once road infrastructure is complete the council takes ownership, so we've been going through detailed approval processes with the relevant authorities to ensure everything is done properly.

A builder is due to be appointed in May with work to commence mid-year and be completed early in 2022. The timeline will be clearer once the builder is on board.
